## About EAST

The project brings together senior scholars, early stage researchers and think-tankers from three continents to provide incisive and systematic analysis of the relations between the EU and the Asia-Pacific. Against the background of the withdrawal of the United States from important global governance regimes, the prospect of a rise in protectionism and the increasing instability of a multipolar world, the European Union and Asian powers have emerged as the strongest advocates of a globalisation and multilateralism. Both the EU and countries in the Asia-Pacific region share a common interest in regional and global stability. At the same time, this relationship is characterised by frequent tensions on issues such as market access, intellectual property rights or human rights, and takes place against a deeper disagreement on principles of state sovereignty and the normative underpinnings of global governance. This network has studied two essential aspects of this relationship between the EU and the Asia-Pacific region in depth: security and trade. Network partners have been selected carefully to ensure the best possible mix of expertise from Europe and the Asia-Pacific, from academic institutions and from think tanks, from different disciplines and from both senior and junior scholars. Contributors to each research group explored the full range of pertinent issues, present their findings as a series of conferences and finally published these in two edited volumes – ensuring in the process the added value of collaborative, interdisciplinary and transnational research and aspiring to share the output of the project with a wide audience from both academia and policy-making.
